# Helena only Montana city on Soviets' tour

he first of two groups of Russian filmmakers to visit Helena will come to town Friday and Saturday, May 18-19 at Second Story Cinema.

Touring with a program called "Red Fish in America," brothers Igor and Gleb Aleinikov will screen and discuss their work and the work of their peers at 7:30 p.m. each night.

The Aleinikovs will present new independent film and video work from the Soviet Union. Helena is the only Montana city on their tour. Although little known, their's is an active and growing community of young, independent media artists who have been working outside government control in the Soviet Union.

Art curator Marie Cieri of Cambridge, Mass. recognized the community and found an appropriate co-curator in Igor Aleinikov, a young independent filmmaker, writer and editor-in-chief of "Cine Fantom," the USSR's only independent film journal.

Igor Aleinikov presented the first public festival of independent Soviet work in Mos-

cow and Leningrad in November, 1987.

"Red Fish in America" attempts to introduce American audiences to a diverse array of startling and provocative films and videos, many not yet seen outside the USSR.

"Red Fish" is a collection of 16 short works by 13 artists, dated 1985-89, which will run over two evenings. Pieces explore the issues of Jewish identity and emigration; societal ills which have only recently been recognized; or witty send-ups of celebrated symbols of Communism.

# 'My Left Foot' to be shown as fundraiser

Second Story Cinema will present "My Left Foot" through Thursday as a special benefit fundraiser for the Grant to Artists Program. The film shows nightly at 7:30 p.m. through Thursday. Benefit tickets will be one dollar more than the regular price. Movie-goers can choose regular tickets or benefit tickets.

"My Left Foot" is the story of Irish artist Christy Brown, who had cerebral palsy and could not control his body except for his left foot. Daniel Day Lewis won an Academy Award for his portrayal of Brown, and his co-star Brenda Fricker received the Oscar for best supporting actress for her performance.

Since it began in 1982 the Grant to Artists program has awarded \$31,000 to artists from Lewis and Clark, Jefferson and Broadwater counties.

The program began when members of the Helena Film Society, Friends of the Film Society and local artists sought a way to encourage art in the tri-county area.

In the past eight years grant awards to local artists have resulted in musical recordings, photographic essays, paintings, fiction, poetry, movement and dance performances, fiber weaving, bronze casting and metal sculpture, among other art projects. Discover Russia through films

Visiting Russian filmmakers Igor and Gleb Aleinikov will present and discuss two separate programs of new independent film and video from the Soviet Union. Both 75-minute programs include experimental, documentary and abstract animation pieces.

Program 1:

Revolutionary Etude, a witty send up of the ideals of the Young Communists organization.

War and Peace, a deftly edited reinterpretation of the famous Russian title.

**Game of Ho** is an ardent exploration of Jewish emigration. **Damn It** is a music video with an environmental message.

Mirages is an unusual music video featuring still life images.

**Untitled** is a long work by Yuris Lesnik, a master of editing illusions. **Tractors** is a piece by the Alenikovs. It is a recasting of the language and symbols of communism.

Program 2:

Orderly-Werewelves, is the first film by Evgenij Yufit, the master of Leningrad black humor.

Spring is a nightmarish but curiously whimsical tale reflecting the brutality

of past regimes.

Dreems is a transcendent journey through images of village life in Soviet

Supporter of Olf is an example of the freewheeling Leningrad style of scratch animation.
