urf, a performance theater work that celebrates and challenges issues of class, education and race relations in Boston over the past two decades, is a mixed-media showcase for the testimony of witnesses to events around the 1974 federal mandate to desegregate Boston's public schools. Created by Obie Award-winning writer/director/performance artist Robbie McCauley, Turf is a collaboration between its New York-

According to creator McCauley, "Turf has a structure similiar to jazz. Its stories are like conversational music, personal and charged and reflecting a range of emotion. They unfold in a jazz-like, organized but improvisational way."

Turf is the second installment of Primary Sources, a series of performance theater works based on race relations in this country during the 1960s and '70s, created by McCauley and produced by The Arts Company in collaboration with local artists in different parts of the US. The first,
